Itinerary

Day 1: Welcome to the Gateway of the Khmer Empire

Your journey into the heart of ancient civilization begins in **Siem Reap**, the vibrant gateway to the world-renowned temples of Angkor.

Arrival & Private Transfer: Upon your arrival at Siem Reap Angkor International Airport (SAI), you will be warmly greeted by your **private local guide and driver**. You will be escorted in a comfortable, air-conditioned vehicle to your hotel in the city center. During the drive, your guide will provide an introductory briefing on the local customs and the exciting adventure that awaits you.

Check-in & Relaxation: After a seamless check-in at your hotel, the remainder of the day is yours to spend at your leisure. You may choose to shake off the travel fatigue with a refreshing dip in the pool or take a quiet stroll to soak in the tropical atmosphere. As the sun sets, the city

transforms into a lively hub of lights and aromas, offering a first glimpse into the warm hospitality of the Cambodian people.

Expert Tips for Day 1:

*Siem Reap is a city that truly comes alive after dark. For your first evening, we recommend taking a short **Tuk-Tuk ride** (a quintessential Cambodian experience) to the famous **Pub Street** and the **Angkor Night Market**. It's the perfect place to enjoy a cold "Angkor Beer" and sample authentic **Khmer Amok** (a fragrant coconut fish curry). To ensure a smooth start to your temple tours tomorrow, we suggest exchanging some small denominations of US Dollars; while the local Riel is used, **US Dollars are widely accepted** and preferred in most establishments. Finally, stay hydrated with bottled water only, and get a good night's rest—the magnificent sunrise over Angkor Wat awaits!*

Day 2: The Grandeur of Angkor & Celestial Spirits

Today, you will journey back to the 12th century to explore the architectural masterpieces of the Khmer Empire, ending the day with a spectacular display of traditional Cambodian performing arts.

Morning: Jungle Mysteries & Sacred Ruins: After breakfast, your exploration begins at **Banteay Kdei**, a serene "Citadel of Chambers" that offers a peaceful introduction to Angkor's spiritual history. Next, you will visit the legendary **Ta Prohm**. Unlike many other temples, Ta Prohm has been left to the embrace of the jungle; witness the staggering sight of giant silk-cotton trees and strangler figs weaving their roots through the ancient stone galleries—a scene made world-famous by the *Tomb Raider* movie.

Afternoon: The Face of Bayon & Ancient Cities: Your journey continues into the fortified city of **Angkor Thom**. Entering through the majestic **Victory Gate**, you will explore the heart of the capital. You have the flexibility to choose **3 out of 5** iconic sites within the complex: the mysterious **Bayon Temple** with its 216 giant smiling stone faces, the mountain-like **Baphuon**, the **Royal Palace**, or the intricately carved **Terrace of the Elephants** and **Terrace of the Leper King**. To conclude your temple circuit, you will visit **Preah Khan**, a sprawling monastic complex known for its endless corridors and delicate carvings.

Evening: Apsara Dance & Tuk-Tuk Adventure: The evening is a celebration of Khmer culture. You will travel by **Tuk-Tuk**—the most authentic and fun way to navigate Siem Reap—to a traditional **Apsara Dancing Show**. As you enjoy a diverse **buffet dinner**, you will be mesmerized by the elegant movements and glittering silk costumes of the dancers, who bring ancient celestial legends to life.

Expert Tips for Day 2:

*The Angkor Archaeological Park is a sacred site with a strict "**Angkor Code of Conduct**." Please ensure your shoulders and knees are covered; a T-shirt and long trousers or a long skirt are perfect. We recommend against using scarves to cover shoulders at the entrance, as guards may occasionally be strict about permanent sleeves. Because today involves significant walking over*

uneven stone steps and through jungle paths, **sturdy, closed-toe walking shoes** are essential. Your private guide will carry plenty of cold bottled water, so stay hydrated! If you're a photography enthusiast, the best light for the stone faces at Bayon is typically in the mid-to-late afternoon, so discuss the timing with your guide to capture that perfect "Khmer Smile" photo.

Day 3: Angkor Sunrise, Pink Sandstone & The Floating World

Today is a journey of light and life, beginning with the world's most iconic sunrise and ending with a deep look into the unique aquatic culture of the Cambodian people.

Morning: The Golden Reflection & Fine Art: Your day begins before dawn as you head to **Angkor Wat** to witness the breathtaking **sunrise** over its five lotus towers. As the sky turns from deep purple to fiery orange, you will see the temple's perfect reflection in the lotus pond. Afterward, explore the interior of this 12th-century masterpiece, the largest religious monument on Earth. Your journey continues to the tranquil **Banteay Samre**, a well-preserved temple that offers a quieter atmosphere. You will then drive through the countryside to a **Sugar Palm Village**, where you can see locals climbing trees to harvest sap and crafting handmade palm sugar. The morning culminates at **Banteay Srei**, the "Citadel of Women." Built from rare pink sandstone, its carvings are so fine and intricate they are often described as having been made by the hands of women rather than men.

Afternoon: Life on the Great Lake: In the afternoon, you will transition from the stone temples to the "heart" of Cambodia—the **Tonle Sap Lake**. You will visit the fascinating **Kampong Phluk Floating Village**, where houses are built on soaring stilts up to 10 meters high to adapt to the rising and falling waters. Board a private boat to cruise through the village, witnessing the daily rhythms of fishermen, floating markets, and even a floating school. It is a humbling and eye-opening look at how the Khmer people have lived in harmony with the water for generations.

Expert Tips for Day 3:

For the **Angkor Wat sunrise**, we recommend arriving at the reflecting pond by **5:15 AM** to secure a front-row spot for your photos; bring a small flashlight as it will be dark upon arrival. Since you will be leaving before the hotel breakfast service, your guide will arrange a **breakfast box** for you to enjoy after the sun goes down. When visiting **Banteay Srei**, keep in mind that the site is small and can get warm, so your wide-brimmed hat will be very useful here. For the **Tonle Sap boat trip**, the experience varies by season: from August to February, the water is high and lush; from March to July, you will see the incredible height of the stilts as the water recedes. Regardless of the season, the sunset over the lake is a hidden gem, so ask your guide about staying a little longer to catch the colors over the open water!

Day 4: Lasting Memories & Farewell to Siem Reap

Your immersion into the ancient glory and modern warmth of Cambodia concludes today, leaving you with a deeper connection to the resilient spirit of the Khmer people.

A Relaxed Morning: After your final breakfast at the hotel, the morning is yours to enjoy at a leisurely pace. You might choose to return to a favorite café for a slow **Cambodian iced coffee**, take one last stroll along the tree-lined Siem Reap River, or simply relax and reflect on the incredible sights of the past three days.

Last-Minute Treasures: This is the perfect time to visit the local markets one last time. Whether you are looking for delicate silk scarves, aromatic spices, or handmade carvings, the city's boutiques and markets offer a wealth of meaningful mementos to take home.

Seamless Departure: At the scheduled time, your **private guide and driver** will meet you at your hotel to provide a smooth transfer to the airport. They will assist with your luggage and ensure you arrive in plenty of time for your departure flight. As you take off, you'll have one last chance to look down at the sprawling temple complexes and the vast Tonle Sap Lake, carrying the "Smile of Angkor" with you.

Expert Tips for Day 4:

*Siem Reap Angkor International Airport (SAI) is located approximately **45–60 minutes** from the city center. We recommend departing your hotel at least **3 hours before your flight** to ensure a stress-free check-in. If you have a few hours this morning, we highly recommend a visit to "**The Artisans Angkor**" workshop; it is a wonderful place to see high-quality Khmer handicrafts being made and is perfect for picking up authentic, ethically-produced souvenirs. For a last-minute gift, look for **Kampot Pepper** (widely considered the best in the world) or **Krama** (the traditional Cambodian checkered scarf). Please remember to keep a few small bills of local Riel or US Dollars for any last-minute airport snacks, and double-check that you have all your electronics and chargers packed before the transfer!*
